## 15% <u>Graded Course Supports (e.g. Homework or class assignments)</u>

- Graded for accuracy, work must be shown (if applicable)
- Late assignments will be accepted at a 50% reduction through the end of the unit. If not done by the end of the unit, a zero will be placed in the grade book.
  If you are absent the day an assignment is due, turn it in upon your return to school for full credit. Things will be marked missing if you're absent. It is your responsibility to show me the completed assignment(s) on your return.

### 85% Graded Course Objectives (e.g Quizzes, Projects, & Tests)

- Quiz is usually announced and covers 2 or 3 sections
- Work must be shown to receive partial credit (if feasible)
- Occasionally, bonus questions will be on tests for extra credit

#### - Option to retake one test per quarter

- 1. Must be taken within one week of taking the test
- 2. Must have completed ALL homework assignments from that unit
- 4. Schedule a time to meet with the teacher to prepare for retake
- 5. The new score will be the average of the two tests

If you are absent from class, it is your responsibility to get the assignment(s) missed and turn them in within the allotted time frame (one day absent = one additional day, etc.). Any handouts you need will be available in the large crate marked Notes/Handouts at the front of the room.
